













The parties to this Treaty have agreed as follows:

- *Advertise* sustainable building for infrastructure through the sharing of resources in coordination with Sustainable Development Goal 12;
 - Invest in the development of sustainable infrastructure and technological machinery through exporting renewable energy, machinery, and/or minerals to ensure the use of more sustainable materials and to maximize resources.
 - Securing investments in building ports, railways, roads, and energy grids that could boost and promote sustainable infrastructure development
- *Foster* collaboration between countries to lower barriers and promote multilateral trade of renewable energy, machinery, and sustainable infrastructure;
 - Address the impact of the sanctions and trade restrictions on the global supply chain, calling for collaboration and encouraging access of trading routes through partnerships between countries and markets.
 - Recognizing the need to work together on advancing technology and infrastructure improvements to ensure supply chains adapt to global disruptions (such as pandemics, natural disasters, and political instability).

Road to Resilience Through Research & Innovation

Name of Treaty: The Resilience Act (*Eiskönigin Act*)

Host Actor: Germany

Signatories: France, United States of America, Indonesia, Saudi Arabia, Japan, Nigeria, Mexico, Seychelles, Thailand, Singapore, Spain, Australia, Russia, Norway

The parties to this Treaty have agreed as follows:

- *Recognizing* the urgency of addressing global supply chains and ensuring sustainability and resilience
- *Encourage* the fostering of diplomatic collaborations and sustainable trade through the exchange of ideas and capacity-building measures between member states, ensuring united action towards more resilient and sustainable supply chains. Such demands regular and more open communication between member states, as well as clauses that will require proactive cooperation.

All parties have agreed as follows:

- *International collaboration with public and private sectors with programs*: Creating a public-private partnership (PPP) funding program on a multilateral level in collaboration with this treaty's signatories in areas such as but not limited to Special Economic Zones (SEZ). This will entail the following:
 1. *Research Program (During)*: Collaboration with universities, research institutions, think tanks, SMEs, and local governments about supply chains.
 - a. To address issues of shortage of labour, this program will be a platform to share resources and workforces to not only improve collaboration, but also facilitate the flow of varying ideas and perspectives, contributing to diversity and personalization.
 - b. The program will also facilitate a training program for each member state's labor force and this will be held in each member state's respective locations. Hence, it is incredibly flexible for everyone.
 2. *Research Program (After)*: Invest in sustainable material sourcing, manufacturing practices, and renewable energy in line with the research findings.
 - a. Additional investments will be put in technology for monitoring and auditing purposes.
 - b. This collaboration will also entail investment and support in supply chain infrastructure development and other forms of technology;
 - i. Focus on power generation technology such as palm oil biofuel.
 - ii. Investments on sustainable and friendly urban transport planning, or eco-infrastructure.
 - c. Utilize the research findings to create and enforce personalized standards for each country's suppliers and other important stakeholders in the public and private sector. This will involve more transparent and efficient management/logistics.
 3. *Feedbacking*: Create an annual feedbacking system to figure out points of improvement in the partnership and dedicate a part of the PPP fund to initiatives for sustainable global supply chains.

- The partnership will serve as a networking device for member states to collaborate and trade on a more specific and efficient level. It will be very based on open dialogue.
